From the bond election from May of 2005 Sudan Schools gained permission to borrow \$1.5 million to use to update, repair, and purchase new equipment. Some of the projects that were of major concern were replacing the track, repairing the roof, replacing the busses (the old busses were at least 20 years old), and other projects that will take place at a later date. Mr. Buddy Lowrance, SISD superintendent, received the busses the last week of September. "They (the busses) represent our school. It is for people to notice our school and our students." Several members of the community and the school started looking for the new busses in July. It took 6-7 weeks for the design and specifications to be met by the manufacturer. The students are very proud and honored to ride in the new Hornet busses.

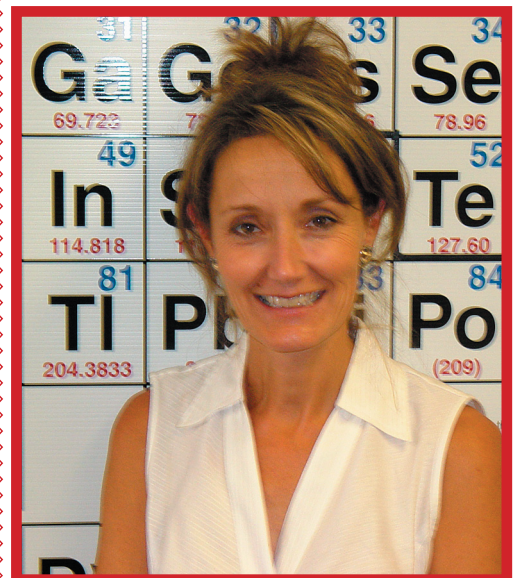
