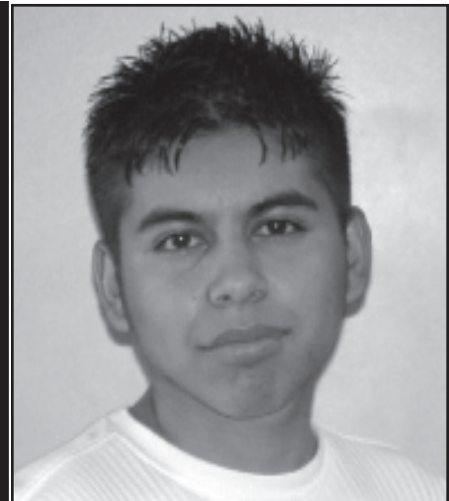


Beth Wallace
