## SUDAN CLEAN-UP PROJECT

...a community service project of FCS classes made possible by cooperation from Sudan ISD, the City of Sudan, the Sudan City Council, the Sudan Economic Development Committee, the Sudan Fire/EMS, the Sudan Community Volunteer Association, the Sudan Alumni Association, Sudan Senior Citizens, and area churches.

The mission is to increase pride in the Sudan community by working together to eliminate weeds, tumbleweeds, trash, and debris making regular maintenance of the community manageable.

Every community citizen may participate. Individuals and families may take responsibility for their own property, that of their neighbors (with permission) or any community member in need of assistance with their property maintenance.

Citizens may participate in the assembly at the high school auditorium. Following the assembly, adults are needed to drive pickups or pickups and trailers to worksites where students will be cleaning weeds and tumbleweeds. These will need to be placed in the pickups and trailers and hauled to a location decided by the City of Sudan.

Citizens may bring covered dish food items in disposable containers to the Sudan Senior Citizens Building on Saturday, April 16, between 8:30 am and 11:00 am for a meal to be served at 12 noon to those participating in cleanup activities on Saturday. Following the meal, recognition will be given for accomplishments and participation in the project.

Everyone involved in cleanup projects please take every precaution to ensure personal safety for yourself and others. Please consider allergies, the possibility of snakes and poisonous spiders, the possibility of broken glass and other sharp objects, proximity to heavy equipment in motion, traffic at work sites, sun exposure, and the need for hydration. Work gloves will be essential.
