TENNIS: This week the tennis team traveled to South Plains College in Levelland for the annual SPCHEA tournament. Sudan did very well in the tournament. The JV boys doubles' team made up of cousins, Deterrance and Jerry Smith, took home the first place trophy. The Varsity girls doubles, Lauren Debnam and Kady Gaston, won first place. Varsity boys doubles, Dagan Provence and Kade Gaston, also took home the first place trophy. At the district UIL tennis tournament the girls dominated the tournament by placing overall team 1st. The doubles' girls was won by Lauren Debnam and Kady Gaston. Jacey Davison placed 2nd in singles, and April Godinez and Elizabeth Trejo won third in doubles. The boys team placed second overall.
