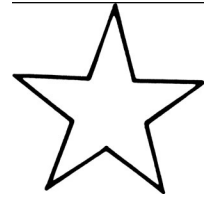

Kade Gaston and Dagan Provence advance again for the third straight year to the State Tennis Tournament in Austin. In Regional play, they won their first 3 games, 6-0, 6-0; 6-2, 6-0; and 6-4, 6-0. They were in usual form defeating teams from Headley, Fort Elliot, and Wellman Union. The Sudan pair were beat in the finals by Miami 4-6, 6-7. The pair will be competing at State on May 9-10, 2005.

Bond Election Set for May 7, 2005

On Monday, February 14th, the Sudan ISD Board of Trustees called for a bond election to be held on Saturday, May 7th. The amount of the bond was set at \$1,500,000. If passed the proceeds of the bond will be used to upgrade activity busses, purchase school busses, and other school vehicles, repave portions of parking lots, resurface and repair track, repair and maintain buildings and grounds, and purchase technology and instructional supplies and equipment.

Using current property values the cost of repaying the bond will be approximately 8.5 cents/\$100 evaluation over five years or 6.5 cents/\$100 evaluation over 7 years.

The financial advantage of doing a bond election is to reduce the effects of recapture on maintenance and operation taxes. Currently for every \$1.00 the school collects on maintenance and operation (M&O) taxes approximately 40 cents are recaptured. If the \$1.00 is collected to repay a bond (I&S taxes) the school gets to keep the entire dollar.

The voters of the school district passed a \$1,000,000 bond election in May of 2000. We made the last payment on the bond last month. We currently have approximately \$32,000 left from that bond. Projects completed with the past bond were: Remodel elementary hallways, installed new carpet throughout the school, purchased and installed new heating/air conditioning units throughout the entire school, remodeled old gym (windows and ramps), purchased four new school buses, purchased a new pickup to be used by the vocational science department, and completed various smaller maintenance and operational projects.

Election day is Saturday, May 7th. Polls are open from 7 AM until 7 PM. Voting sites are the community center in Sudan and the Vo. Ag. Building at Three Way School Campus.
