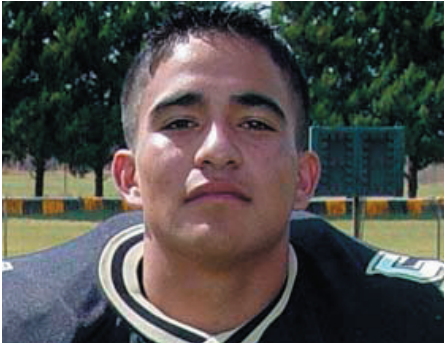

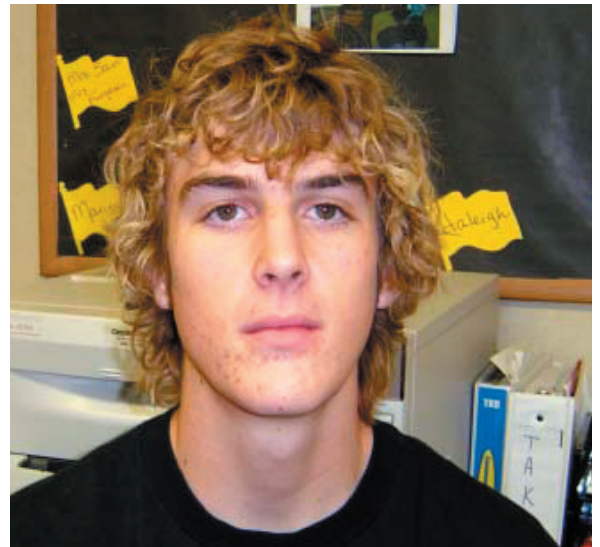


## Osbaldo Jimenez

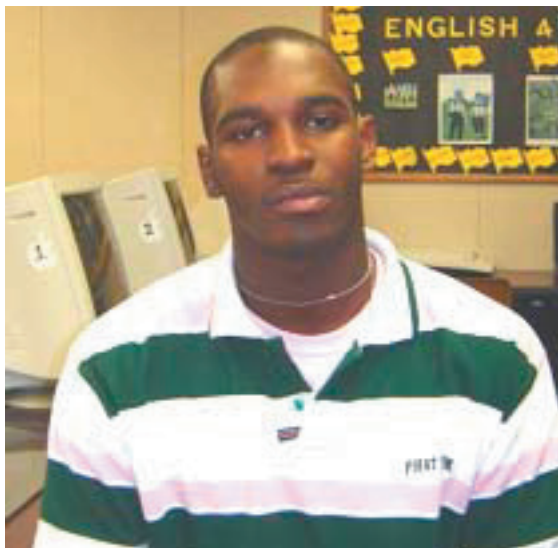
## Garrett Scisson

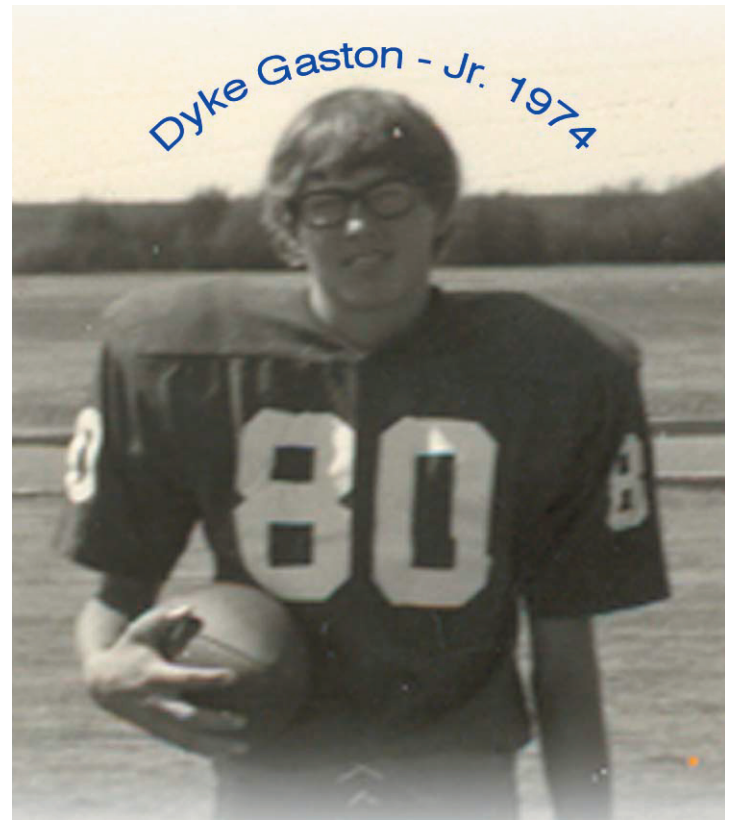

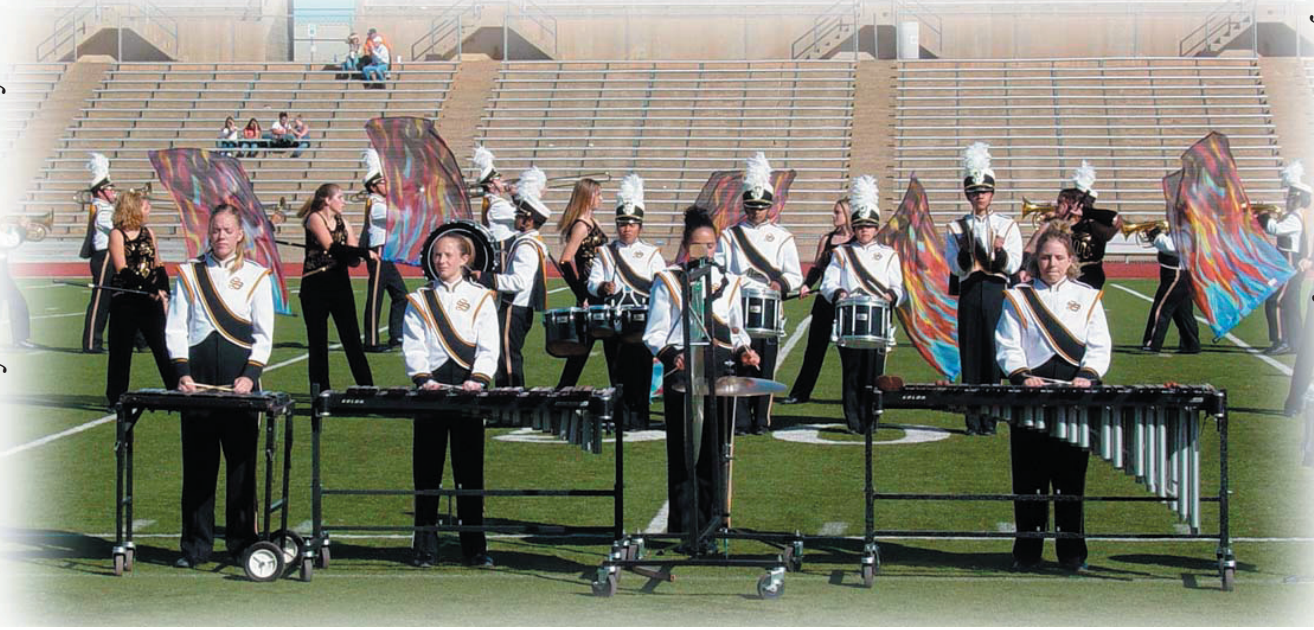
