Students Raise over \$2000 for Tsunami Relief Fund

Presents Check to With Love From Lubbock Campaign

6th Grade Earns Over \$500 in Bake Sale

After seeing the destruction caused by the tsunami that struck southeast Asia, the National Honor Society and the Student Council challenged their classmates, the school, and the town to donate their spare change to help Lubbock with the "With Love From Lubbock" campaign. The officers of these organizations delivered cans and boxes around town and into the classrooms.

In less than a week, the people of Sudan, old and young alike, donated over \$1500.00 to the cause. Some of the elementary students had already started collecting money, so they were already aware of the need for such donations. Some children emptied their penny banks and gave Christmas money.

The officers from NHS and STUCO delivered the check to KCBD. Pete Christie accepted the check, and they were a featured news story that night.

Kyle Maxfield

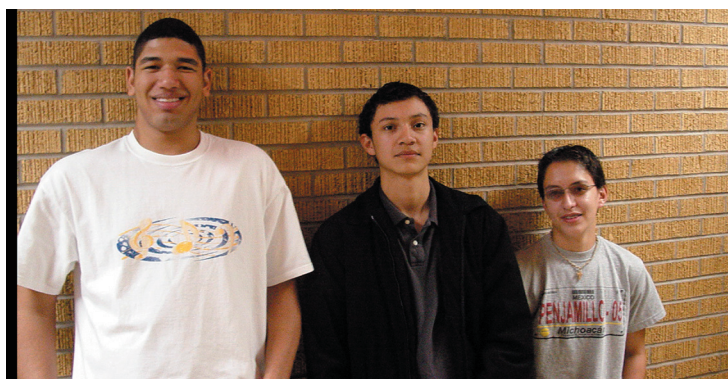

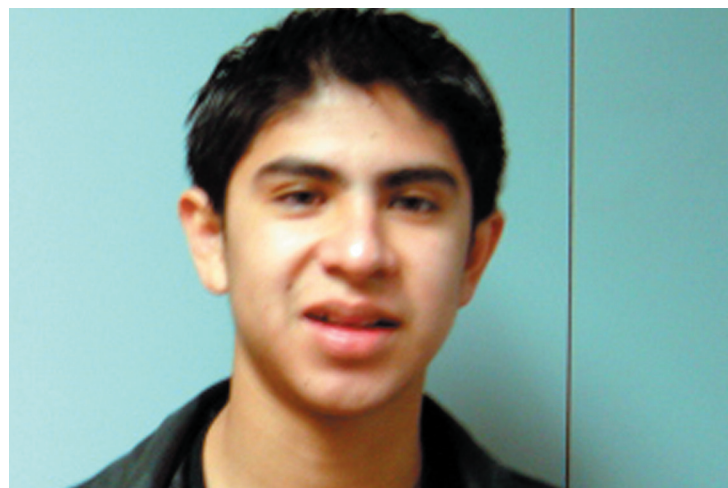

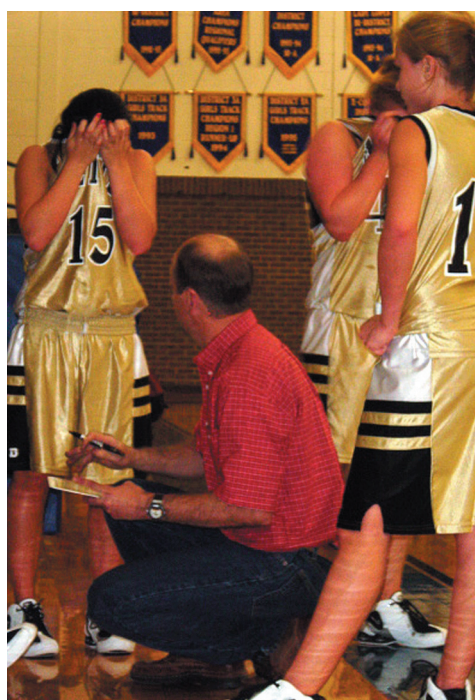


Kady Gaston
