The senior team of Lauren Debnam and Michael Warren went undefeated for the tournament. They brought home the first place trophy and have earned a trip to the state tournament in Austin which is held over Spring Break.



Important Notice: Bond Election Set for May

On Monday, February 14th, the Sudan ISD Board of Trustees called for a bond election to be held on Saturday, May 7th. If passed, the proceeds of the bond will be used to upgrade activity busses, purchase school busses and other vehicles, repave part of the parking lot, resurface and repair track, repair and maintenance of buildings and grounds, and purchase of technology and instructional supplies and equipment.

The financial advantage of doing a bond election is to reduce the effects of recapture on maintenance and operation taxes. Currently, for every \$1.00 the school collects on maintenance and operation (M&O) taxes, approximately 40 cents are recaptured. If the \$1.00 is collected to repay a bond, the school gets to keeps the entire dollar.

The school voted a 1 million dollar bond election in May of 2000. We made the last payment on the bond last week. We currently have approximately \$28,000 left from that bond.

Projects completed with past bond include the following: remodel and add new carpet to elementary school, purchase and installed new heating/air conditioning units throughout elementary and high school, remodeled old gym, purchased new school busses, various smaller maintenance and operational projects.
